

E4 Carolinas Expands its South Carolina Presence to Support Clean Energy

South Carolina Clean Energy Business Alliance Members Support

E4 Carolinas, a longtime collaborator with the South Carolina Clean Energy Business Alliance, is expanding E4 Carolinas' South Carolina presence to provide enhanced clean energy promotion in South Carolina.

David Doctor, E4 Carolinas' Chief Executive Officer added, "With the blessing of the South Carolina Clean Energy Business Alliance, E4 Carolinas intends to employ Bonnie Loomis, the current Executive Director of SCCEBA, to provide the greatest opportunity for that expansion and the promotion of South Carolina clean energy industries. Effective July 1st, Bonnie would serve as E4 Carolinas' South Carolina Managing Director. The E4 Carolinas Board of Directors will evaluate adding events that compliment those made popular by SCCEBA as well as new E4 Carolinas events in South Carolina".

The Task Force is charged with engaging, aligning and promoting all South Carolina clean energy industries to attract and retain the foremost clean energy companies, innovators and leader; to accelerate economic growth; to make efficient resource use; and to care for our environment, resulting in increased employment, productivity and prosperity. Once employed by E4 Carolinas,
