As Governor of South Carolina, he initiated the Education Improvement Act, the Employment Revitalization Act, the S.C. Research Authority, regional nuclear waste compacts, merit-selection of public service commissioners, greater openness in government, and a constitutional amendment creating a state reserve fund.

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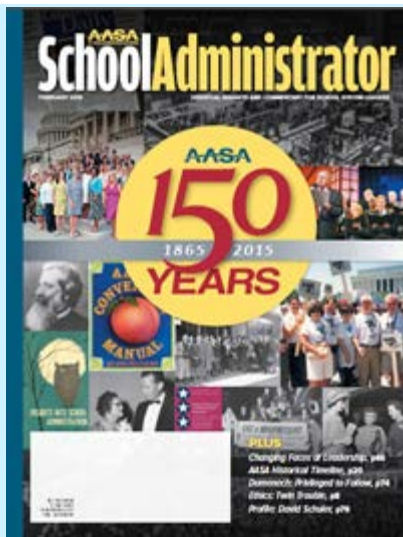
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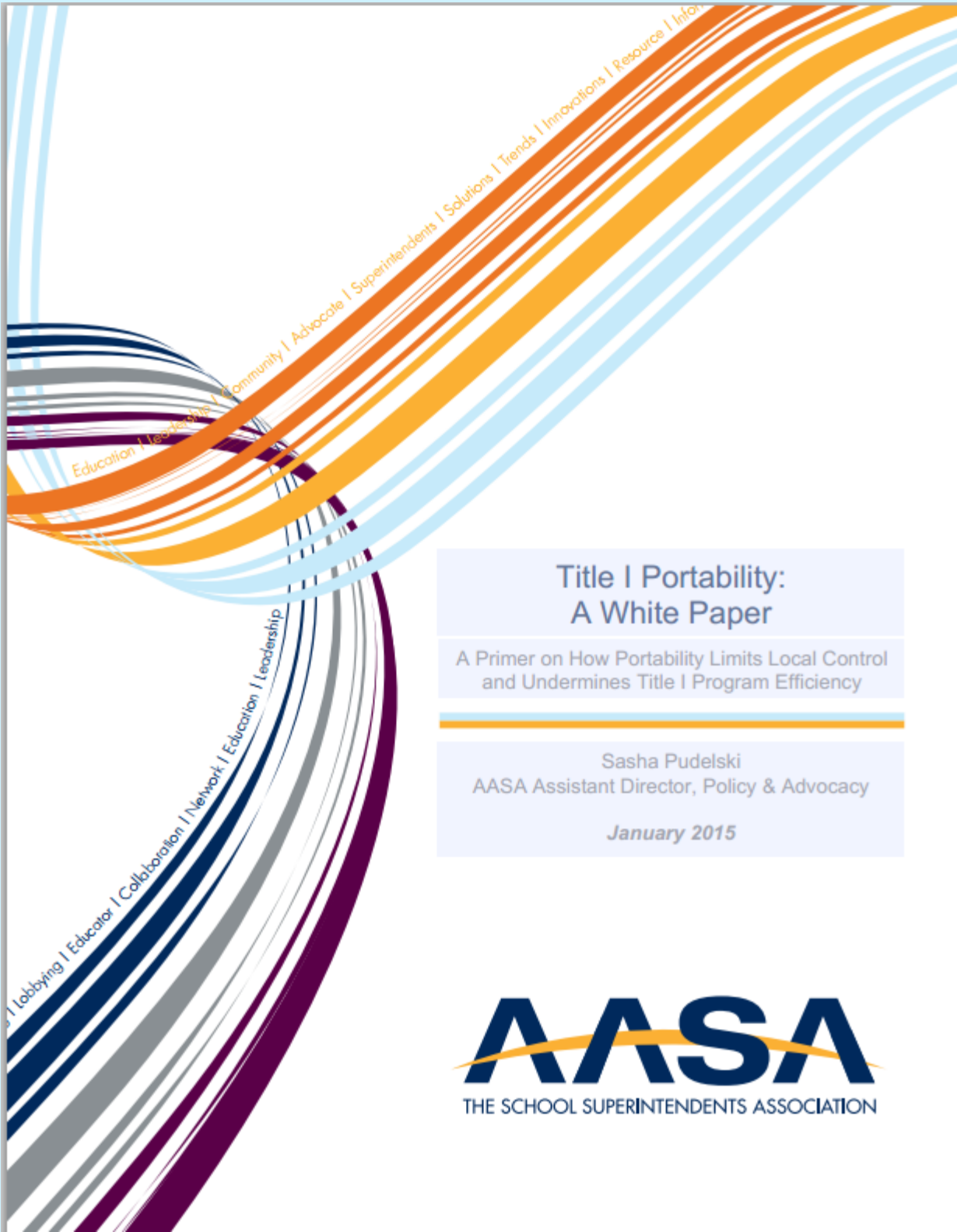
