Law firm Nelson Mullins Riley & Scarborough has completed its acquisition of the Florida-based Broad & Cassel on 1 August in a deal that will strengthen the firm's growing infrastructure practice.

The merger will bring 15 infrastructure attorneys to Nelson Mullins, resulting in a 21-person team in that practice. [Marcus Lemon](#), who was hired last month from Polsinelli, is part of that group.

The combined team has experience advising in airports, transportation, social, power and private industry infrastructure.

Among the former Broad & Cassel partners coming aboard are Carlos Loumiet, who was involved in Florida's first P3 deal, the [I-595](#) toll road, and C. David Brown, former head of the Florida Transportation Commission.

Other senior P3 attorneys joining the firm include Robert Alfert, former special counsel to Greater Orlando Aviation Authority, as well as Joseph Stanton and A. Wayne Rich.
