### **Sheria Clarke Appointed to GSSM Foundation Board**

Nelson Mullins of counsel Sheria Clarke has been appointed to the Foundation Board for the South Carolina Governor's School for Science and Mathematics from 2019 to 2020. Clarke practices white collar defense and government investigations in the Firm's Greenville and Washington, D.C. offices.

The Governor's School foundation supports the efforts of the school by voicing its needs, raising funds, and informing the public of its accomplishments. As a member of the Foundation Board, Clarke will help govern these efforts alongside fellow stakeholders from across the state. The Governor's School for Science and Mathematics was founded in 1988 as an option for the state's most talented and motivated students. It is among only 12 other schools of its kind in the nation.

Over the course of her career, she has provided legal and investigative work on scores of congressional hearings, witness interviews, and investigative strategies. Clarke earned her J.D. from University of North Carolina School of Law.
